Scoring	<p>Total Score Range: 400-1600</p> <p>The total score is the sum of the two sections: The Evidence-Based Reading and Writing (EBRW) and Math sections. Each of these two score sections has a possible score range of 200-800.</p> <p>Sections scores are based on your raw score in each section, which is the number of questions you answered correctly.</p> <p>SAT Superscore = the process of colleges accepting your highest scoring section across all test dates you took the SAT.</p>	<p>Total Score Range: 1-36</p> <p>Each section is scored separately. One point is awarded for each correct answer, and you do not lose points for wrong answers or unanswered questions.</p> <p>Your total score is the average of your four section scores.</p> <p>The optional Writing section score is based on four separate domains. Each domain is assigned a score from 1-6. The Writing score does not count toward your final ACT composite score.</p>
